Heike Van Gunst

Heike van Gunst was born in 1966 and lives near Hamburg in Germany. From early childhood on she grew lots pot plants and vegetables. When she was 13 years old, she saw a bonsai tree for the first time, in the window of a furniture store, and was fascinated. At the age of 15 she tried to grow



bonsai trees from seeds, read a first basic bonsai book in German language and her passion grew. Heike would have liked to study horticulture or biology and languages, but ended up with economy and computer science. For many years she worked as a consultant in the IT business, until she got married and her two daughters were born.

She kept growing bonsai trees as a hobby, learned from books, magazines, an internet forum and the comrades in a local club. In 2007 she founded a new local club, the Bonsai AK Hamburg & Umland, began to visit exhibitions and workshops and met many other bonsai people from different nations. Heike joined the team of the German BONSAI ART magazine in 2013 and became the chief editor in 2016. She translated

demos and workshops for several foreign bonsai artists and a number of bonsai books. In 2017 she traveled to Japan for the World Bonsai Convention and was deeply impressed and influenced by what she saw there. In 2018, 2019 and 2023 Heike was invited to Chinese bonsai/penjing exhibitions in Rugao and Nanjing as a demonstrator and 2019 to Canberra, Australia, to teach workshops and perform on the demo stage. Since 2018 she has showed a tree or shohin display at every issue of Europe's most prestigious bonsai exhibition "The Trophy" in Belgium. In 2021 she took part in an online exhibition of BonsaiKunstHamburg and the demo, which she did together with Sandra Grlica, can still be found on YouTube. Heikes private bonsai collection contains around 120 bonsai trees (most of them medium and small size), around 80 accent plants und a varying number of young plants. She grows a great number of different species and has developed most of her trees herself over many years, aiming to master all the necessary techniques. With more than 40 years experience, Heike especially likes to share her knowledge about longterm bonsai development and bonsai pot choice.





California Bonsai Society is proud to announce: The Ben Oki Bonsai Scholarship Fund. The California Bonsai Society (CBS) has set up a scholarship fund to honor Ben Oki - a man who devoted most of his life to enjoying and sharing bonsai. Ben was happiest when he shared his knowledge or worked on a tree.

To honor that sharing spirit Ben had, we will be making two \$1000.00 grants available to anyone in the bonsai community to be used to attend classes, workshops, study with a pro, or other bonsai-related educational activities. The winners will also need to do something to give back to the bonsai community- such as a club demo or online video showing what you learned or some other method of giving back to the community.

To apply, the applicant should send an email to:

In that email, they should explain what they intend to do with the money to improve their bonsai skills and what they intend to do to give back to the bonsai community. Be creative.

Applicants who receive scholarships agree that in return for these funds, within 15 days of completing class, etc., they will provide CBS photos and a short write-up of what they did with the funds to improve their bonsai skills that will be published on our website and in our newsletter. They will also have to come up with and complete a way of giving back to the community and commit to doing this.

The application period will be annually from May 1st through May 30th, with the scholarships awarded on June 15th. Applications will be accepted by anyone in the bonsai community who can deposit a US bank check. Awarding the scholarships will be by decision of a committee of California Bonsai Society Board members after going through all applicants. All committee decisions are final. Everyone in the bonsai community is encouraged to apply for this chance to expand their bonsai knowledge and to help contribute to the bonsai community.

Our February meeting Wirth visiting artist

Kris Springer

Kris Springer had a very successful visit to the bonsai clubs participating in the CBS Visiting Artists Program. In fact I probably took more notes during his demonstrations than with any other artist. My notes include phrases like 'pitch pine mutants', the use of perlite for bonsai soil, the advantages of Minwax wood hardener, using super glue on a dremel wire brush to help it last longer, JB Weld glue, and most amazingly, the use of preparation H to facilitate rapid healing of large cuts on trunks.

Unfortunately, we had technical difficulties at the actual CBS meeting and were Unable to stream Kris's talk so we had a question and answer session.
